Purpose

This pamphlet offers a snapshot of a Handbook on Researching Wallace Family Genealogy. The Handbook (HB) can be viewed at <u>clanwallace.org/cw/genealogy/</u>. It contains more detailed information on how to conduct your family genealogy research.

Initial Research

- Assemble the names of all living family relatives from both sides.
- Interview relatives.
- Obtain names of deceased relatives from grandparents, uncles, and aunts.
- Ask relatives if there is a published family genealogy.
- Ask relatives if there are any surviving family bibles. If none.
- Check local church records (Mormon, Mennonite, Amish, Quaker, and Presbyterian).
- Develop genealogy charts (pedigree and/or ancestral chart).
- Use separate charts for allied families if other than Wallace.
- Record different surname spellings, i.e., Margret, Margaret, Marguerette, Margurite).
- Record known families on a single-Family Group Record.

Research Tips

- Make concise notes with bibliography and source location.
- Biographically profile every individual
- Xerox whatever you can.
- Ask librarians/archivists about indexes. Read first (could be combined.)
- Arrive with appropriate charts (pedigree/ancestral) and a list of research items.
- RootsWeb.com: Surname List of spellings. Wallace Spellings are in App. "B" of HB.
- Check the following county records:
 - Birth and death certificates.
 - Census Records and Reports.
 - Will, Probate, and Estate records.
 - Deeds, plats, and land grants.
 - o Marriage and divorce records (county).
 - Adoption records.
 - o Military records.
 - o General court records.
 - o Inheritance lawsuit records (lots of civil records).
 - o Newspaper obituaries, cemetery headstones, church/cemetery records of burials.

Hiring a Genealogist

- Check churches listed in Interview Relatives, for folks conducting genealogy research.
- Get names from an archive, genealogy society, patriotic society, or publication.
- Check the list of family research specialists in back of <u>Scottish Roots</u>, by James Alwyn.
 - Write to a genealogist. Inquire about credentials/fees. Assess what is especially needed.
 - Provide all information required for conducting searches ancestor's full names, dates and places of birth and death, and places lived.
 - o Put your request in the form of a questionnaire. Contract with the genealogist to do only three or four hours at a time, and that they send you a report thereafter.
 - o Reports should include places searched, sources checked, and documentation in full.
